June 2018 - May 2019

Overall Strategy

Maintenance of the wonderful Waterside community spirit continues to be our aim, we try to continuously improve communications, and with our new website hope to welcome in a new era of transparency.

Your Committee:

After 4 years active contribution to the Committee Patrick Kershaw and John Krebs stood down midyear, they have both put a lot into Waterside and we continue to benefit from the changes they have made to how we work. The revised Committee, comprising Kay Gordon, Allison Hood, Sarah Munro and Helen Saunders-Gill, were augmented by new members Jen Watkiss as Treasurer and Sarah North, and met 4 times. Helen is now leaving the Committee after contributing greatly to the maintenance of standards in our grounds, through litterpicks and thoughtful advice. She continues to enhance Waterside with her lovely Balliol Court garden.

We would really like a new committee member from the Merton Court/Balliol Court/Crescent area to balance our representation, so please put your name forward via our email.

Waterside Events:

Some old favourites continue, but others have dwindled, we are always interested in new activities that we can support, so let us know.

The **Sports Day and BBQ 2018** was attended by well over 180 residents and friends and made £300 for our local charity My Life My Choice, which supports young people with learning difficulties to get their voice heard. Feeling flush with funds we invested in a splendid new BBQ which grilled the food instead of the helpers, we also made setting up easier with 2 pop-up gazebos that have had several outings in 2018/19. With the gift of another gazebo from the Hatch family we have reached peak storage in the shed.

The International Picnic hosted by Richard and Ying Groves in September was really appreciated by all attendees.

The **Hallowe'en Party** organised by Allison Hood was once again a real hit, with some seriously scarey children and masses of incredible pumpkins illuminating Waterside.

Our March litterpick, which is part of the Oxclean initiative had modest results, due in the main to the year-round efforts of some residents.

Sadly once again the **Easter Egg Hunt** could not be run. Unless we have a volunteer to drive this it may fall by the wayside.

We should also thank **Penny & Sinclair** for their generous **Sponsorship** of the Bouncy Castle at the Sports Day.

Waterside Communications:

The closed Oxford Waterside Facebook group currently has 112 resident members and is highly recommended.

The website has had additional information added which shows which areas Nicholsons are responsible for. It is good to see that plans are underway to update the 20 year old planting by Berkeley Homes. We are slowly but surely adding local information and links, including the archive of Newsletters.

The tradesman listing still needs more input, but has made a good start.

Welcome packs continue to be revised and sent to new residents, but you need to advise us of changes so we can make sure they are made welcome in a timely manner.

Our **Email** list reaches over 120 households, and is also used by the Management Company to reach owners.

Noticeboards continue to support local organisations, managed by Sarah Munro and Sheila Forbes.

19th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2018

Held at 8pm on Tuesday 26th June 2018 at St Margaret's Institute, Oxford Chaired by Kay Gordon

Minutes of the last meeting were approved.

 Apologies for absence were received from John Krebs, Sarah Munro, Helen Saunders-Gill, Allison Hood.

3. Report of the Committee

The aims of the Association continue to be demonstrated by a wonderful community spirit. Over the past year we have seen the development of the Neighbourhood Watch, now driven by the closed Facebook group, the website has been relaunched with much improved access and content, the shed has unburdened several homes of equipment and materials, and our events continue to thrive.

4. Chairman's Statement

Many people contribute to making Waterside great, but special mention should go to a few: The year started with superhuman efforts by Jonathan Finnerty and Mike Ward erecting our shed. This had the knock-on effect of allowing Stuart Skyte and several others to empty out valuable space in their sheds. For the first time we know what kit we have.

John Krebs has continued to enhance our fences with native hedging which has grown well. Helen Saunders-Gill has revised the site plans to show areas of responsibility for grounds. Allison Hood has set up and oversees the Neighbourhood Watch, which is functioning well.

The Hood family has also made a huge impact on the children's activities through Allison and David's energy and enthusiasm.

Sarah Munro has set up a completely new tradesmen listing, which we still need recommendations for.

Alex Cadoux-Hudson has created an excellent new website for us all to use.

A special presentation was made to Stuart Skyte, who is leaving Waterside for Waterways. In recognition of his dedication to the Waterside community and outstanding contribution to the development of a harmonious and inclusive culture, Oxford Waterside Residents' Association are pleased to confer on Stuart and Gillian Skyte lifetime membership of the association and free tickets to the Annual Waterside BBQ in perpetuity.

5. Annual Accounts

Patrick Kershaw reported a healthy bank balance and recent appetite to buy useful equipment such as gazebos and a new BBQ.

6. Annual Fee

It was agreed to leave the £5 annual fee unchanged.

7. Election of the Committee

The following members are continuing to stand: Kay Gordon, Patrick Kershaw, Helen Saunders-Gill, John Krebs, Allison Hood and Sarah Munro. Patrick Kershaw will stand down from the OWRA committee once a replacement treasurer has been found.

8. AOB

Juliette Ash raised the problem of antisocial behaviour associated with drugs and the need to understand how to deal with individuals in a positive way. She will follow up with Allison Hood to establish a way forward.

The controls over Facebook members were questioned. Only individuals known to be resident on Waterside are accepted as members, once they have left they are deleted. There is no way to police the background of members and anyone using recommendations eg. babysitting services, need to make their own checks.
