Rail Update

During the past year, OWRA has held meetings with Network Rail, Oxford City Council and Public Health England. The main focus of discussions has been on noise from idling trains, and measurement of current noise levels. At our request, Network Rail commissioned a noise study in Waterside, which showed that noise levels have not increased since the last measurements a few years ago. Network Rail inform us that:

After July, when the current work on the track and new signalling system should be completed, there should be no planned idling of freight trains in the Waterside area.

In the slightly longer term there will be fewer, but longer, freight trains.

The Environment Agency has asked them to remove trees along the trackside in order to enhance the flow of water in the drainage ditch by the track. OWRA contacted the Environment Agency and Oxford City Council and consequently there will be a meeting to discuss whether the ditch can be cleared without tree removal.

Report of the OWRA Committee

June 2017 - May 2018

Overall Strategy

Maintenance of the wonderful Waterside community spirit continues to be our aim, we try to continuously improve communications, and with our new website hope to welcome in a new era of transparency.

Highlights of the year for gardens:

Nicholsons are maintaining the gardens to a higher standard than the previous contractors, John Krebs is the contact for all Waterside residents. They have responded to requests for particular pieces of work, such as replacement of overgrown plants, and will continue to introduce improvements when time and resources allow. Some residents are not maintaining their own front gardens properly and an attempt to generate community action to deal with this in Balliol Court failed through lack of interest. It is now planned to invite Nicholson's to tender for tidying up these front gardens and to ask the tenants or owners to pay for the work. Volunteers have planted more hedging at the Aristotle Lane entrance to Waterside to discourage graffiti on the fences. The saplings are thriving.

OWRA/OWMC Rail Group

The group has been very active and engaged with all parties to put forward our concerns. Regular updates have been provided via the Newsletter.

Waterside Neighbourhood Watch

This newly created group has brought local focus on safety and security that has been particularly evident through our Facebook group. OWMC have also added practical measures such as locked gates to rear accesses.

In recent months, there has been a marked decline in burglaries on Waterside, our PCSO Claire Bonneville has noted the improvement, and put this down to a combination of awareness, vigilance, and offenders being moved out of the area.

The Committee, comprising Kay Gordon, Allison Hood, Patrick Kershaw, John Krebs, Sarah Munro and Helen Saunders-Gill, met 3 times.

Waterside Events:

The **Hallowe'en Party** organised by Allison Hood was once again a real hit, with some seriously scarey children and masses of incredible pumpkins illuminating Waterside.

No **Carol Singing** this year, but if anyone wants to lead us in song we will follow!

Our March **litterpick**, which is part of the Oxclean initiative had to be postponed due to several inches of snow on the ground, but went ahead a week later with a pleasingly poor haul, due in major part to the year-round efforts of some residents.

Sadly the **Easter Egg Hunt** could not be run, but on a wet and miserable weekend that was a blessing. We attempted to get everyone gardening over Easter as well, but despite all our efforts not enough people came forward to join in.

Our latest venture is a **Travel Book Club**. We should also thank **Penny & Sinclair** for their generous **Sponsorship** of the Bouncy Castle at the Sports Day and also our Hallowe'en treats.

Waterside Communications:

The closed **Oxford Waterside Facebook group** currently has 101 resident members and is highly recommended.

Thanks to Alex Cadoux-Hudson's skills the **website** has been relaunched in a phone/tablet/computer friendly format with much new content and the ability to rapidly add/change what you see. The link to the newsletter has been electronically sent to everyone on our email list and also posted to our Facebook group, so most of you will have some idea of the new look and feel. We aim to put news and information links into the website to give a single source, and the all new tradespeople list will be a great resource for us all.

Welcome packs continue to be sent to new residents, but everything is now on the website, so will be revised in the coming year.

Our **Email** list reaches over 116 households, and is also used by the Management Company. **Noticeboards** continue to support local organisations.

18th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2017

- Hedging: Anti-graffiti hedging has been planted and there are plans to plant more
- Network Rail: The Rail Group, whilst unsuccessful in the recent bid to insist on Network Rail mitigation measures, has enabled us to make our collective views well known to the authorities and demonstrated solidarity together with other residents associations in the area
- 3. Further Matters
- OWRA Facebook: Everyone is encouraged the join the OWRA Facebook group even if only joining the closed group and not engaging in any other Facebook activity. This allows fast exchange of information amongst residents. This was especially helpful during the recent spate of antisocial activity in the area.
- **OWRA Website:** The website upgrade, which had been delayed, is to be worked on shortly and there will soon be more news.
- Planning Matters: If anyone would like to volunteer to help inform OWRA residents of upcoming planning applications in the area, this would be welcomed. The issue of HMOs (House of Multiple Occupation) and Covenants is dealt with by the Management Company.
- Neighbourhood Watch: Allison Hood has volunteered to coordinate a Neighbourhood Watch group. Around 20 residents have already

joined. Those wishing to join should complete the form on the back of the recent Newsletter and return to Allison Hood at 16 Plater Drive

- Equipment Shed: OWRA is to install a shed where OWRA equipment (BBQ, litter-pickers, road-signs etc) can be stored in an undercover and secure place. The Management Company has made a space for the shed available behind a faux-garage-door near Merrivale Square.
