If you are here in Oxford for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, you will find all the details overleaf about our Waterside activities.

Save the date in your diary for the OWRA AGM, which will be a Summer Party held in Merrivale Square on the evening of **Tuesday 12th July**.

In this issue we are also highlighting the Councils proposals for transport restrictions, which your Committee were given a sneak preview of last week.

Our Waterside community is very supportive of drives to increase sustainability and reduce pollution: working from home, electric vehicles, using bikes and walking are becoming normal for us. Sadly the improvements proposed to the Woodstock and Banbury Roads cycle and pedestrian ways have been shelved due to lack of funds, but we shall have 139 new electric buses.

The transport plan for Oxfordshire has set out a vision to deliver a **zero-carbon transport network by 2040** and help create a thriving county, tackle inequality, protect our environment and improve the health and wellbeing of residents.

There are three strands to the current plans:

- An expanded ULEZ (ultra low emissions zone) in 2023, which will encompass a wider area than the current city centre zone which has operated since February 2022 https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/residents/roads-and-transport/oxford-zero-emission-zone-zez/charges-oxfords-zez
 - This is intended to raise funds for further transport improvements.
- A series of '**Technical Gates**' in 2023, a new name for 'Bus Gates', which would cut North Oxford off from all other Oxford locations except via the A34 and A40. Even electric vehicles will not be allowed through these gates, as the intention is to reduce traffic so that all buses can run on time over an expanded area.
- A **workplace parking levy** for larger businesses of £600 pa per employee parking space, subject to govt approval.

Public consultation on these proposals begins in the Summer of 2022, and we shall keep you abreast of developments and how to participate. The Technical Gates would have greatest impact on older and disabled drivers, and young families who are forced to use their cars to get about (eg. 14 miles return trip to the station).
